

Purpose: The HNCU scholarship is intended to give financial assistance to a deserving member student. It is not intended to cover all expenses. Applicant should not assume a scholarship has been awarded until officially notified from Horizons North Credit Union. The scholarship application process is intended to ensure recipient, and all applicants, have basic financial knowledge to assist them after graduating from high school.

Award: HNCU will award one or more \$1,000 scholarships to assist in obtaining further education or training in a school of higher education. Scholarship will be awarded without reference to race, creed, color, religion or sex. **To be considered, please complete official application and return to LaTrice Brewster at Horizons North Credit Union by April 26, 2024.**

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. Graduating from high school in 2024.
2. Must have a scholastic record of 3.0 GPA or better. If student attends Pathways or Vantage Point High schools they need to submit record for their time at that school.
3. Must register for at least six (6) credit hours per semester or be considered a full-time student at an accredited, vocational school, college or university by the fall semester of 2024.
4. Applicant or legal guardian of applicant must be a HNCU member in good standing.

DISQUALIFICATION/ CANCELLATION OF SCHOLARSHIP

1. Recipient will not be a full-time student in the fall of 2024.
2. Termination from school or dropping out of school will result in the cancellation of the award and any remaining funds will be returned to HNCU.
3. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
4. Application packets received after the deadline will be disqualified.

AWARD DISBURSEMENTS

1. Award amount will be sent directly to school identified by recipient in two disbursements, one per semester, for the 2024-2025 academic year.
2. **Recipient is responsible for providing HNCU with information needed to send payment to scholarships/financial aid office.**

1st Year Applications

1. Submit completed HNCU application by end of business day, 4/26/24. Mailed applications must be postmarked by or have email timestamp of 4/26/24.
2. Submit a personal essay.
3. Submit two (2) letters of recommendation from non-family members.
4. Create a digital movie or electronic presentation that can be distributed via HNCU social media outlets. **Do not include identifiable information in submission, project will be posted on public sites.** Select **one** of the topics below for entry:
 - Why is financial literacy important to young adults?
 - What is your plan for maintaining good credit throughout your secondary education journey?

If presentation is larger than 10 MB send an email to latriceb@hncu.org requesting dropbox link. Request must be made by 04/12/24. Final application and project must be received by final deadline date, 04/26/24.

2nd Year Applications

1. **Students that received a 1st year scholarship in 2023 are eligible to apply for a 2nd year scholarship in 2024.**
2. Applicant must have maintained a C- average, or equivalent, during their first year of continuing education.
3. Completed six (6) credit hours or equivalent per semester.
4. Complete the “Personal Information” section of this application and submit a copy of transcripts. **Unofficial copies will be accepted.**
5. **Submit above items by end of business day, 4/26/24.** Mailed applications must be postmarked by or have email timestamp of 4/26/24.

Criteria & Consideration Process for Horizons North Credit Union Scholarship

Academic Commitment: Candidate demonstrates a high academic achievement level reflected in a high grade point average (GPA); test scores (CAT & TABE or PLATO); taking a variety of challenging classes; few, if any, lost classes; and maximum effort exerted in the classroom.

Leadership: Candidate is willing to take on leadership roles (whether formal or informal); serves others as a positive role model; active in school-related decision making; has successful involvement in leadership classes; and is willing to motivate and inspire others.

Perseverance: Candidate has held to a course of action; has not given up in challenging circumstances; has overcome obstacles; and succeeds by following through with goals.

Citizenship: Candidate engages in positive behaviors; serves others as a positive role model; promotes mutual respect and appropriate confrontation; is willing to help others; and is active in school related activities.

Service: Candidate has been helpful to staff and other students; engages in volunteer efforts both in school and in the community; serves as a student assistant and/or tutor; and is consistently committed to the well being of others.

Rating Scale

Students measured on a scale of 4 (four) to 1 (one) as follows:

- 4 Student clearly demonstrates all of these qualities both in their written application and in actual behavior/accomplishments while enrolled in school. The student's application accurately and honestly highlights their skills and achievements in this category. In addition, this student is a natural in this category outside of school and as an alumnus and show "staying power" with regard to their future goals. This candidate is an outstanding representative of the best that can be attained while attending school.
- 3 Student demonstrates these qualities at the point of graduation, although student may have encountered minor "ebbs and flows" during enrollment. Student behavior/accomplishments are accurately reflected in this application, and in general, student has demonstrated accomplishments at a proficient and commendatory level. This candidate represents the rewards of striving hard while attending school.
- 2 Student demonstrates some, but not all, of the qualities and may demonstrate strengths in certain areas. During enrollment, this student may have had a slow start while enrolled in school. The candidate demonstrates some ability for sustainable accomplishments in one or more of the areas yet may be better matched with an alternate recognition.
- 1 Student demonstrates minimal accomplishment in each of the areas and may, in fact, not demonstrate significant strengths in more than one area. Although this student may have potential, their behavior and accomplishments while attending school may not demonstrate sustainable contributions in these categories.

Final decisions will be made by the scholarship committee based outlined criteria.
